WEEKEND CAMPING PATROL EQUIPMENT/SUPPLIES LIST

A typical camping trip for Troop 7 will involve leaving on a Saturday morning, and returning Sunday morning around lunchtime. When preparing supplies for the patrol for the weekend, adjust this list based on your menu planning – there is almost certainly more here than you need. Extra equipment and gear will just weigh your patrol down. With that said, here's an overview of how to prep the patrol for a weekend trip:

Cooking Gear:

- Stove and fuel (fuel may be supplied by Troop)
- Lighter / matches
- 8-quart pot, 4-quart pot, fry pan (lid for pot), griddle, coffee pot, other as needed
- Dutch oven (remember oil for seasoning and possibly aluminum foil as a liner)
- Cutting board
- Mixing bowls / measuring cup
- Utensils – pancake turner-spatula (plastic if working with Teflon pans), ladle, knife, serving spoons and forks, vegetable peeler, can opener, whisk, tongs
- Oven mitt / pot holders / hot pot grabber (utility pliers)
- Water jug(s)

Food:

- Do you have all the ingredients you need for whatever meals you're preparing?
- Spices / salt & pepper / sugar / cinnamon / hot sauce
- Butter / cooking oil
- Syrup
- Hot cocoa / cold drink mix

Cleanup:

- Soap
- Sponge and/or scrubbing pad (be careful when cleaning Teflon pots/pans – no metal)
- Disinfecting bleach or tablets
- Plastic wash basins for 3-bucket method
- Paper towels
- Garbage bags (13-gallon kitchen size if you have to carry garbage out)

Other Patrol Supplies:

- Plates / bowls / cups / mugs – one per patrol member, if Scouts don't supply their own, or to have as extra in case a patrol member forgets their own
- Dining fly with ropes
- Propane lamp
- Duct tape
